SUBSCRIPTIONS 2010/11

Subscriptions have been due since 1st September, so if you have received an invoice with this newsletter you need to renew NOW! Your Committee has decided that an increase is due, and has also added a new rate for 11-20 year olds. This new rate has been decided upon as they currently pay the same rate as under 11's and yet can train twice a week as opposed to once a week for our younger athletes. 11-20's also have the benefit of free travel to away league matches. However, we have also added a cap on families with more than two children, who will only have to pay a maximum of £80.

If you get your subs to us before January they will be at the old rates, otherwise you will owe the new rate as below:

Renewal rates are:

Over 20 (first claim)	£45
Over 20 (second claim)	£25
Under 11's	£25
11-20 (and full time students)	£35 (maximum of £80 per family)

HAPPY 90TH BIRTHDAY SYLVESTER!

Sylvester Stein

Highgate's oldest active sprinter is 90 on Christmas day

25 December is a special day for many people but for Highgate's oldest active member, Sylvester Stein, it is very special indeed. It will be his 90th birthday.

Until very recently Sylvester was competing on the track over 100m and 200m and many of you may remember that he took part in one of the club's recent open meetings. He still holds many national age records and was multiple national champion and record holder not only for his own age group but at the same time for several younger divisions whose times were inferior to his own.

Sylvester came to athletics relatively late in life and with his wife Sarah was a leading light in organising veteran athletics in the UK. He was the owner and publisher of *Running Magazine* and of many newsletters such as *Peak Performance*. He came to the UK from South Africa where he was editor of *Drum*, the only journal under apartheid that was staffed entirely by black people (apart from Sylvester). His activities and his books provoked displeasure in the South African government and eventually he had to leave the country. He continued to write books and plays and his play *Who Killed Mr Drum* was successfully staged in London only five years ago.

He underwent heart surgery in his 60s but rapidly returned to competitive sprinting. Even though he has now hung up his spikes he and Sarah still go weekly to the gym and he regularly takes their dog on its daily walk.

The club is very proud to have Sylvester as a member and *The Gate Newsletter* wishes him a Happy Birthday and Good Health.
